BANKRUPTCY LAW SECTION SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Bankruptcy Law Section for the State Bar of Texas is offering a **cash scholarship** and **admission to the Annual Jay L. Westbrook Bankruptcy Conference** to law students pursuing careers in the bankruptcy/insolvency field who have (a) unique backgrounds, (b) overcome obstacles or adversity, and/or (c) demonstrated a commitment to removing barriers to opportunities within the legal profession.

Criteria for eligibility:

- The scholarship program is open to 2L and 3L law students who have unique backgrounds, overcome obstacles or adversity, and/or demonstrated a commitment to removing barriers to opportunities within the legal profession. While financial need is not required, it may be considered.
- The candidate must demonstrate a commitment to pursuing a career as a bankruptcy attorney in the State of Texas.

Application requirements:

The Bankruptcy Law Section welcomes all students who meet the above criteria to apply. Applicants will be assessed based on the following criteria:

- A completed application.
- A personal statement discussing (a)(i) their unique background, (ii) how they have overcome obstacles or adversity, and/or (ii) how they have demonstrated a commitment to removing barriers to opportunities within the legal profession, and (b) the applicant's interest in bankruptcy law.

Application deadline and instructions:

To be considered eligible, interested applicants must submit a completed application, along with personal statement, via mail or email by **October 21, 2025**. The scholarship winner and other applicants will be notified of the results at the by early November. Address submissions to:
